



# PA TANF & CCDF Spending: Quarterly Update

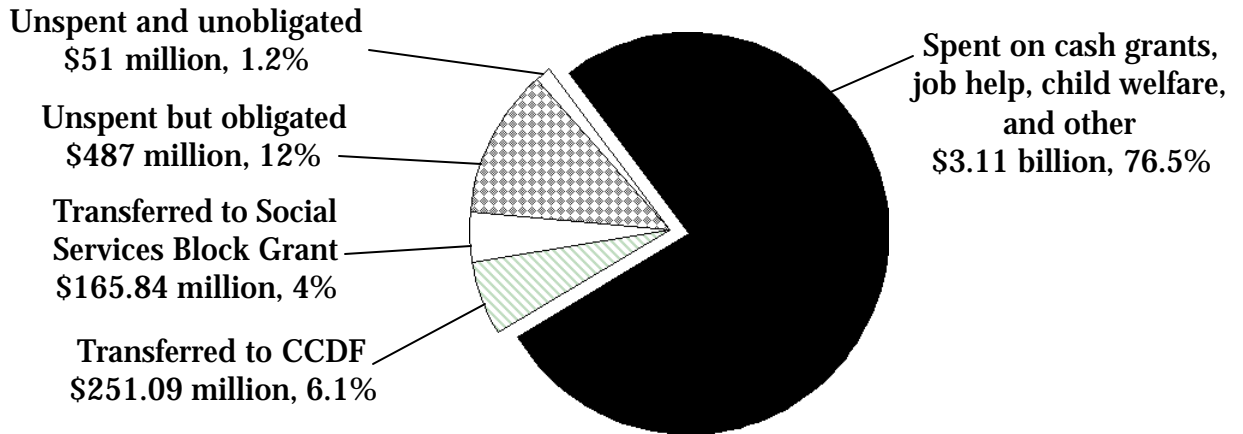
Pennsylvania Partnerships for Children

In September 2002, 161,019 Pennsylvania children were receiving TANF

From the beginning of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) in March 1997 through September 2002, Pennsylvania has not spent \$538 million of its total TANF award. However, \$487 million of that has been obligated for future spending, and **the state's child care funds are now all earmarked for spending.**

### PA TANF spending as of September 30, 2002\*

Total TANF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$4.06 billion



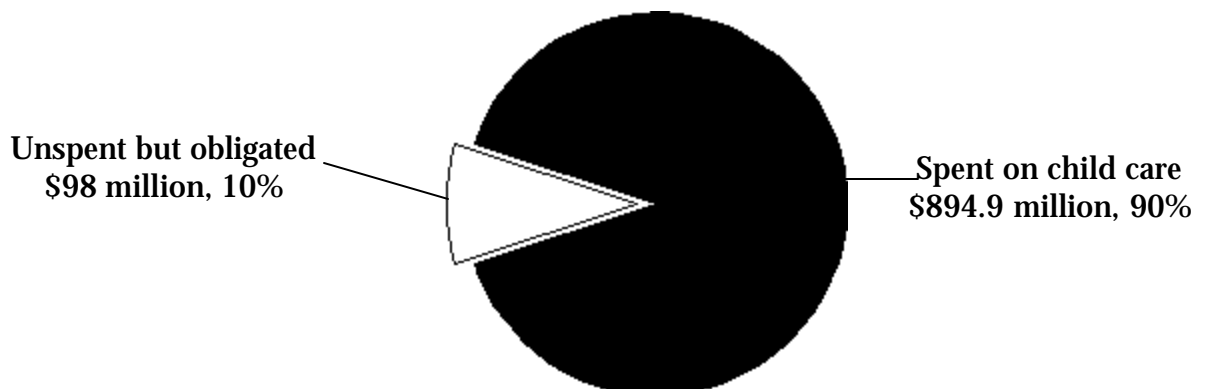
### PA Child Care Development Fund spending as of September 30, 2002\*\*

Total CCDF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$741 million

Transferred from TANF to CCDF: \$251 million

Total dollars available for CCDF: \$992 million
