

Pennsylvania TANF & CCDF Spending: Quarterly Update

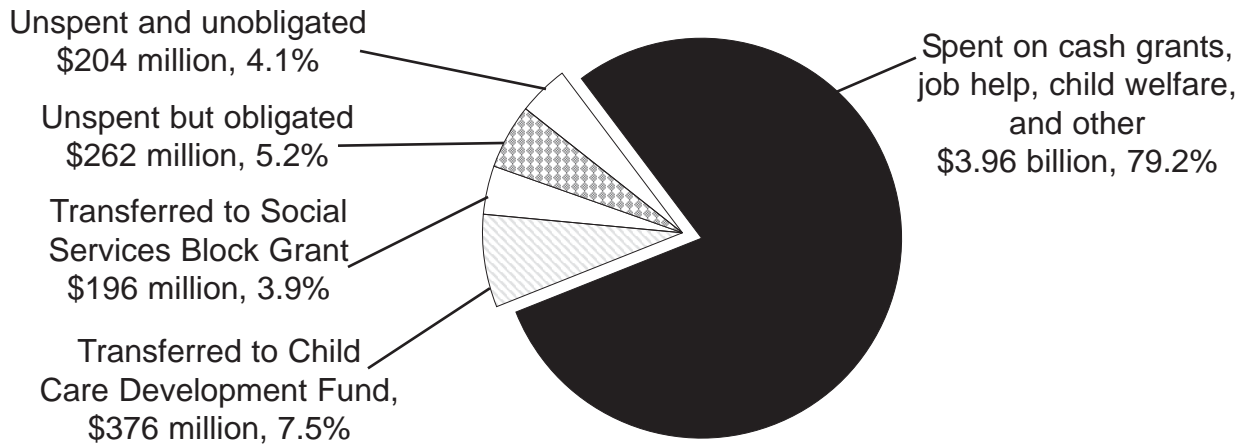

In December 2003, 166,803 Pennsylvania children were receiving TANF

From the beginning of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) in March 1997 through December 2003, Pennsylvania has not spent \$466 million of its total TANF award. However, \$262 million of that has been obligated for future spending.

Total TANF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$5 billion



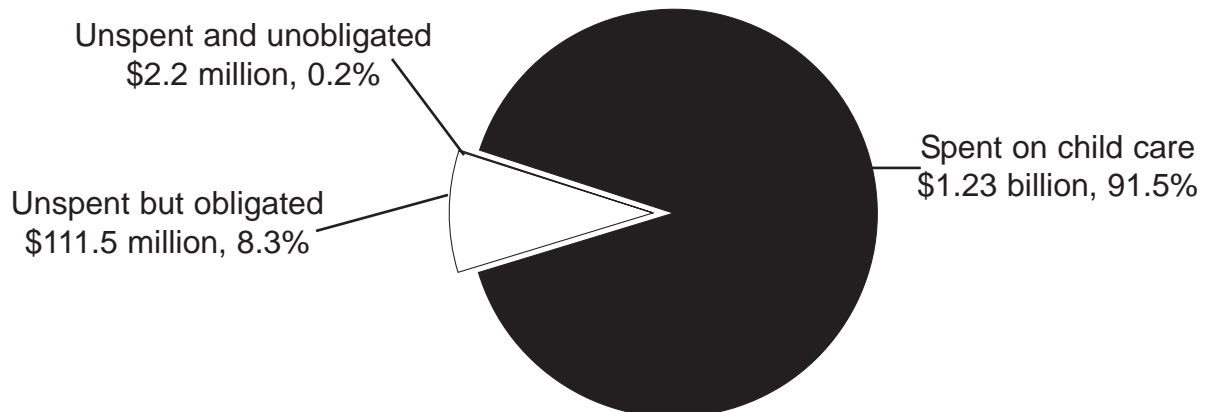
PA Child Care Development Fund spending as of December 31, 2003**

Total CCDF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$972 million

Transferred from TANF to CCDF: \$376 million

Total dollars available for CCDF: \$1.35 billion

Unspent and unobligated: \$2.2 million
