

PA TANF & CCDF Spending: Quarterly Update

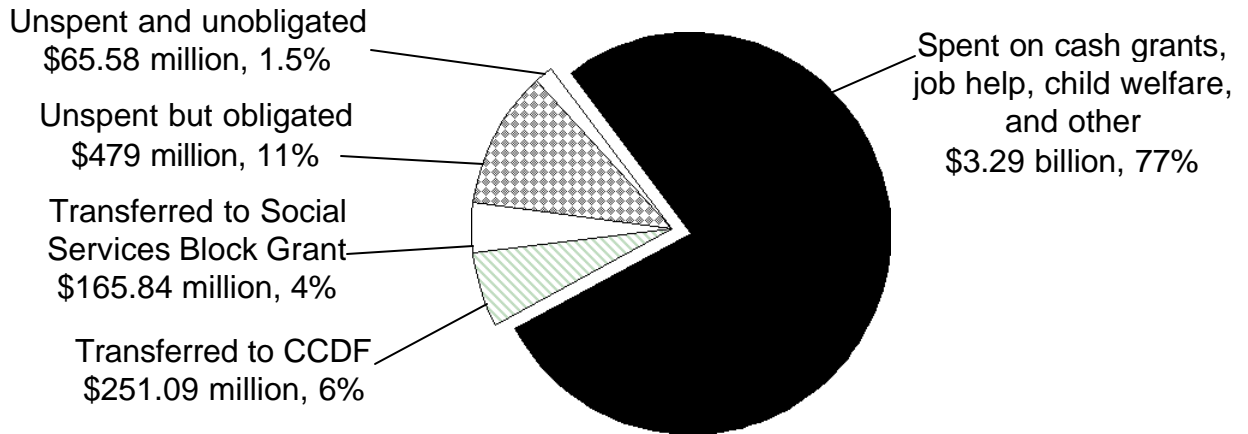

In December 2002, 163,455 Pennsylvania children were receiving TANF

From the beginning of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) in March 1997 through December 2002, Pennsylvania has not spent \$545 million of its total TANF award. However, \$479 million of that has been obligated for future spending.

Total TANF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$4.25 billion



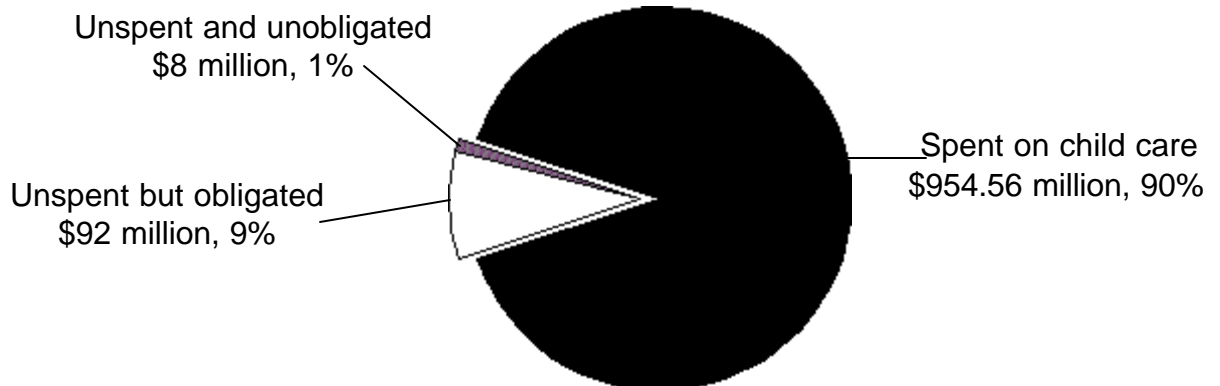
PA Child Care Development Fund spending as of December 31, 2002**

Total CCDF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$803 million

Transferred from TANF to CCDF: \$251 million

Total dollars available for CCDF: \$1.05 billion

Unspent and unobligated: \$8 million
