

# PA TANF & CCDF Spending: Quarterly Update

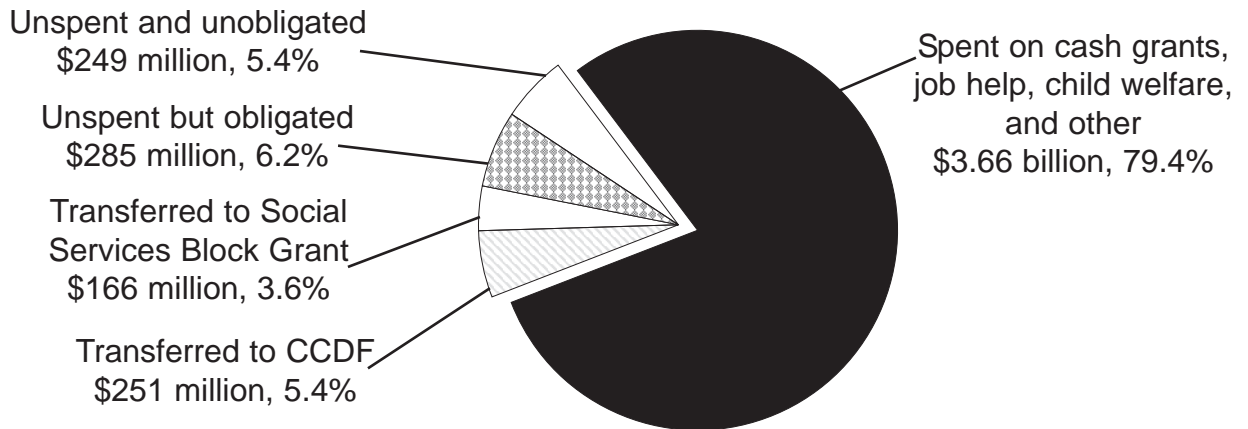

**In June 2003, 161,028 Pennsylvania children were receiving TANF**

From the beginning of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) in March 1997 through June 2003, Pennsylvania has not spent \$534 million of its total TANF award. However, \$285 million of that has been obligated for future spending.

**Total TANF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$4.61 billion**



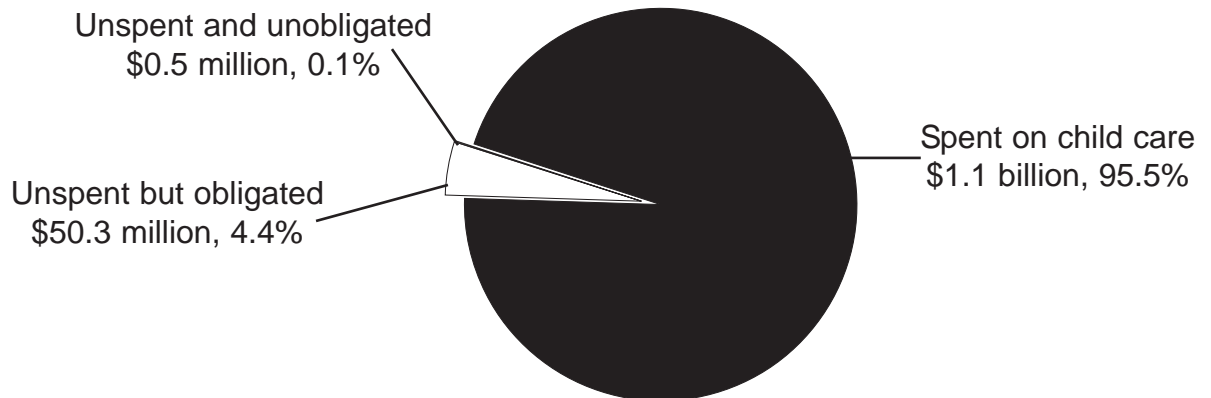
**PA Child Care Development Fund spending as of June 30, 2003\*\***

**Total CCDF federal dollars to Pennsylvania: \$896 million**

**Transferred from TANF to CCDF: \$251 million**

**Total dollars available for CCDF: \$1.15 billion**

**Unspent and unobligated: \$0.5 million**
