

### **CHILD WELFARE**

**BLACK CHILDREN** AND HISPANIC **CHILDREN** have disproportionately higher rates of CPS referrals

**BLACK CHILDREN** AND HISPANIC **CHILDREN** have disproportionately higher substantiation rates

**BLACK CHILDREN,** HISPANIC **CHILDREN AND CHILDREN OF MULTIPLE RACES** have disproportionately higher rates of valid **GPS** allegations
