

There are 15 factors defined by the Adoption and Foster Care Analysis and Reporting System (AFCARS) technical bulletin issued by the Administration for Children and Families which are federally required data elements that the state must track and report.












Top 5 Placement Reasons of All Children in Foster Care in













Of Re-Entries into Foster Care
