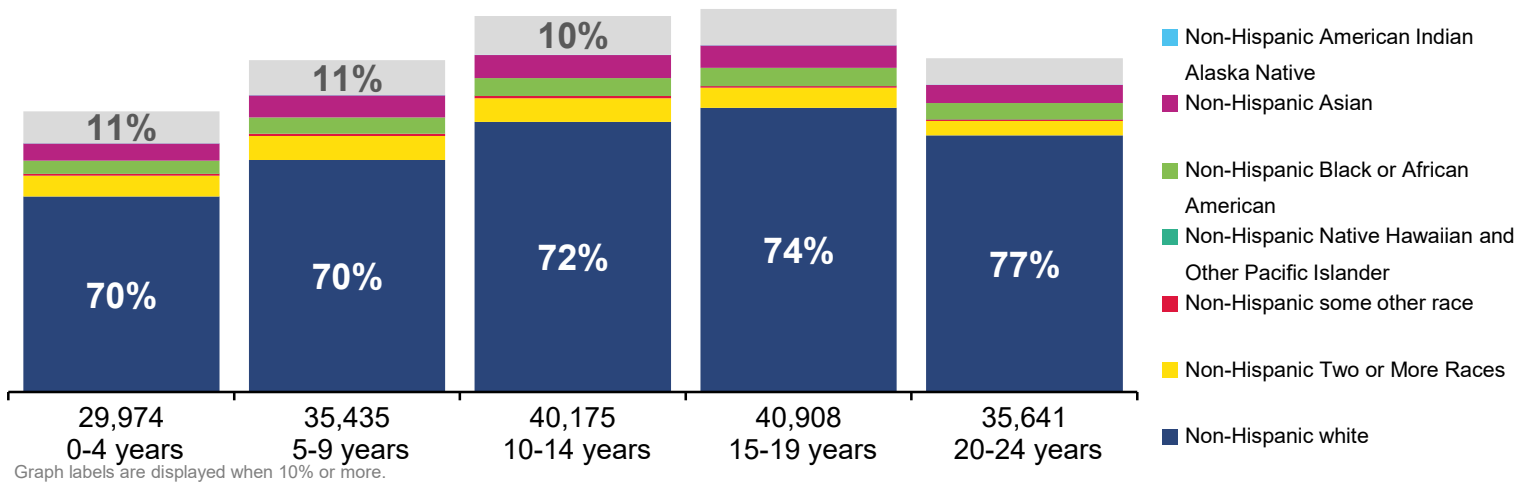

Population Diversity (2020 Census)

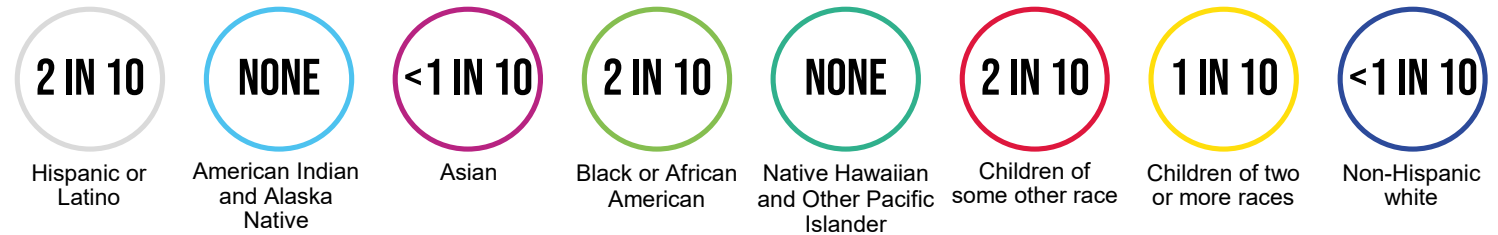

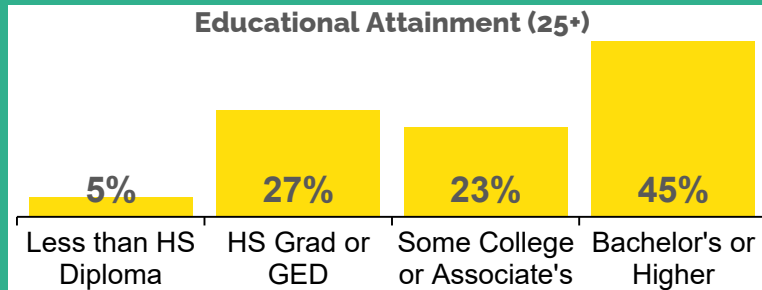

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT
