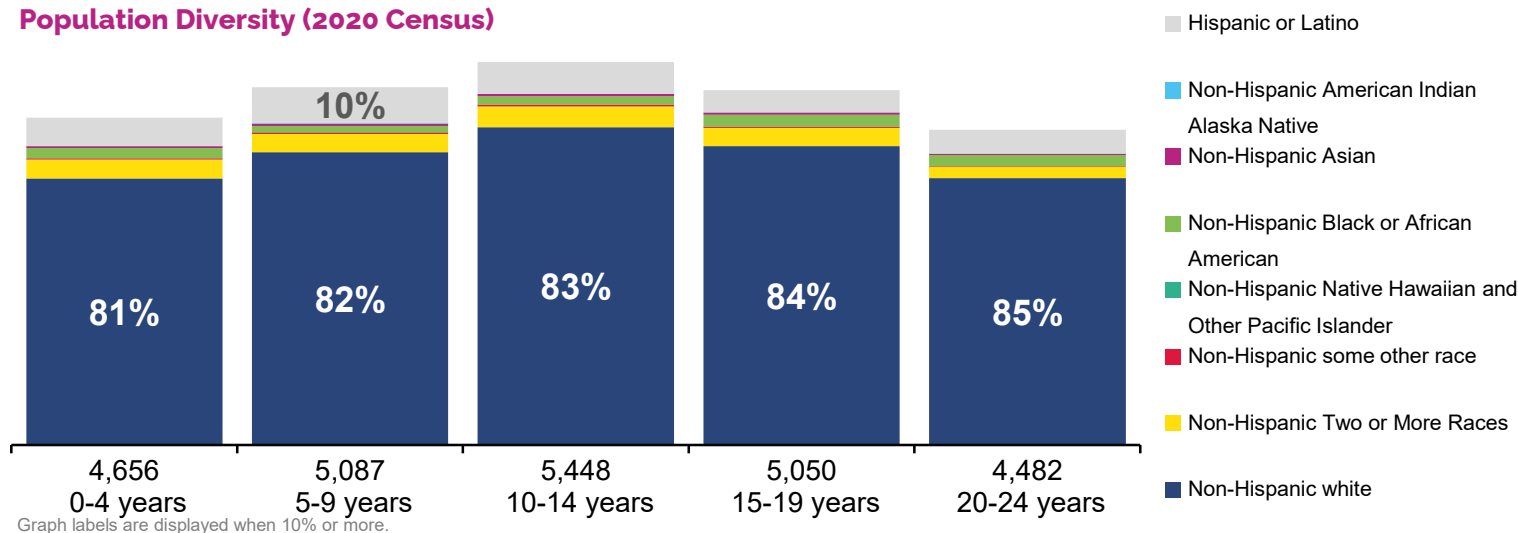

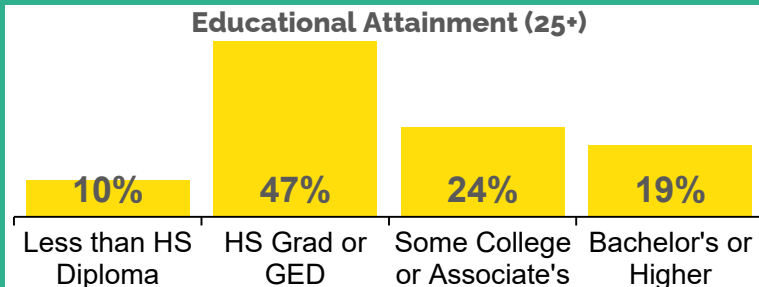

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT
