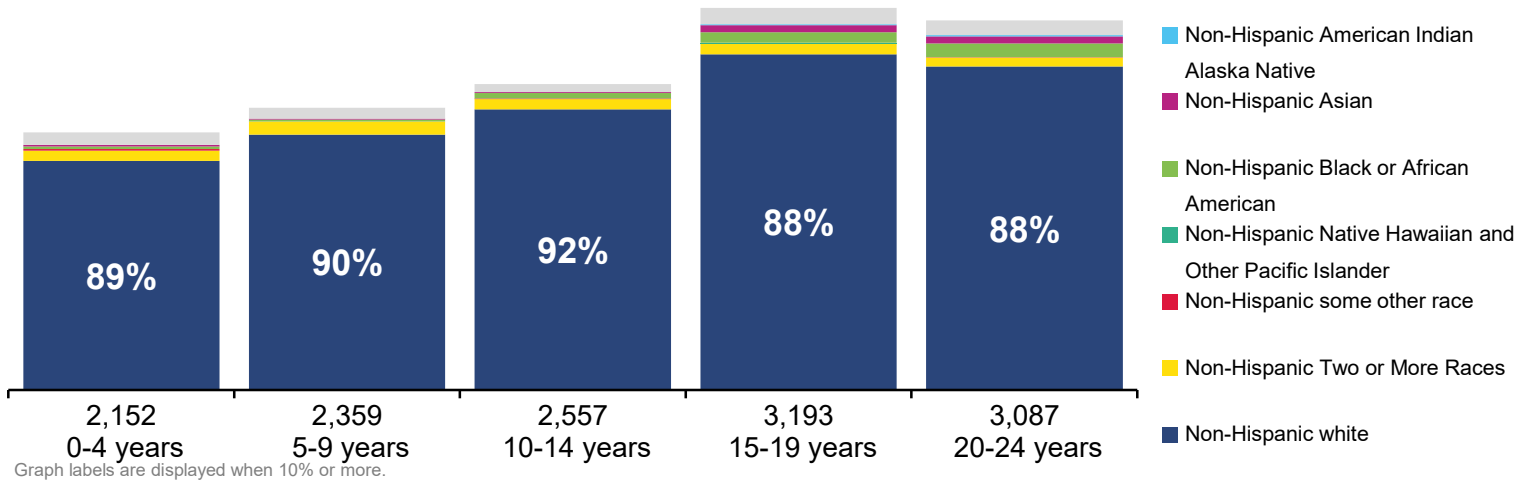

Population Diversity (2020 Census)

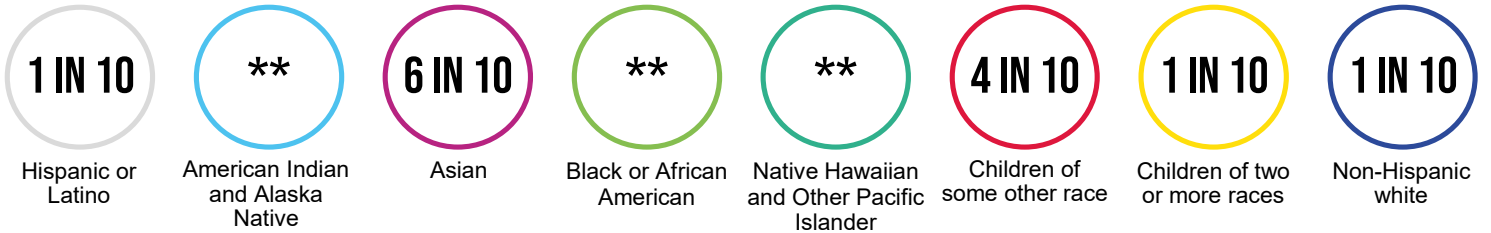

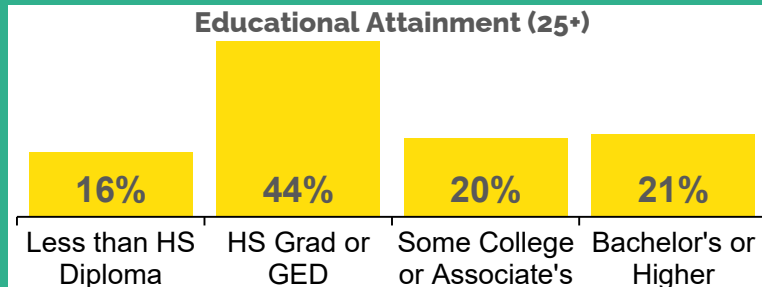

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

BLACK CHILDREN AND HISPANIC CHILDREN have disproportionately higher rates of CPS referrals

WHITE CHILDREN AND HISPANIC CHILDREN have disproportionately higher substantiation rates

BLACK CHILDREN have disproportionately higher rates of valid GPS allegations

2 IN 5 GPS reports screened-out

27% of assessed GPS reports were valid

EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION

110 children enrolled in publicly funded, high-quality pre-k; yet **454** eligible children remain unserved

45 more educators are needed to serve all eligible pre-k children

93% of infants and toddlers eligible for the subsidized Child Care Works program remain unserved

2.1%-20.8% of children under age 5 in Child Care Works are in high-quality care

32% of child care licensed capacity for children under 5 is high-quality

HOME VISITING

545 families are most likely to benefit from evidence-based home visiting services

53 families receive evidence-based home visiting services

K-12 EDUCATION

More than **4,200** enrolled students in **2** school district(s) within the county

43% of school district students are economically disadvantaged

54% of 3rd graders score proficient or advanced in English Language Arts as measured by the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA)

46% of 8th graders score proficient or advanced in math as measured by the PSSA

323 students enrolled in career and technical education

PERINATAL AND CHILDREN'S HEALTH

20% of children under 19 have no health insurance

41% of all children in the county are enrolled in Medicaid or CHIP coverage

228 children in the county enrolled in health coverage through Pennie™, the state's health insurance marketplace

76 infants and toddlers receive services through Early Intervention Part C

57% of eligible infants, young children and women participate in the Pennsylvania WIC program
