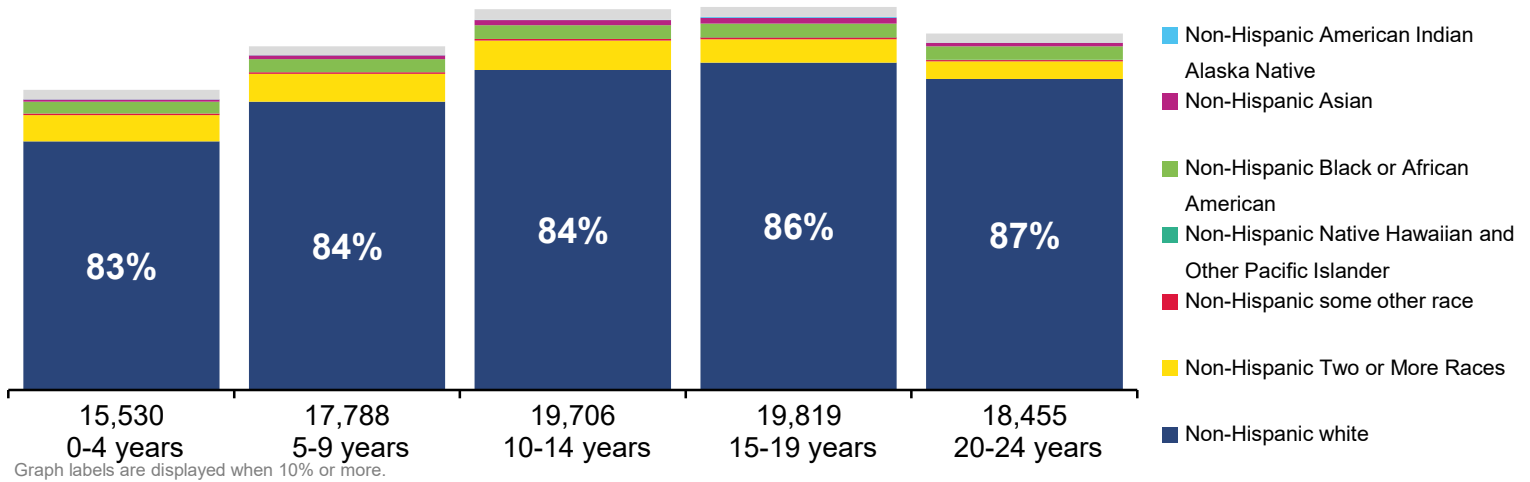

Population Diversity (2020 Census)

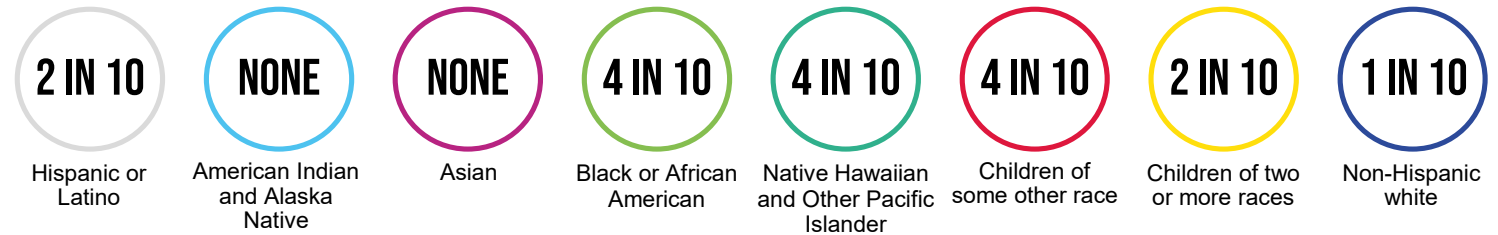

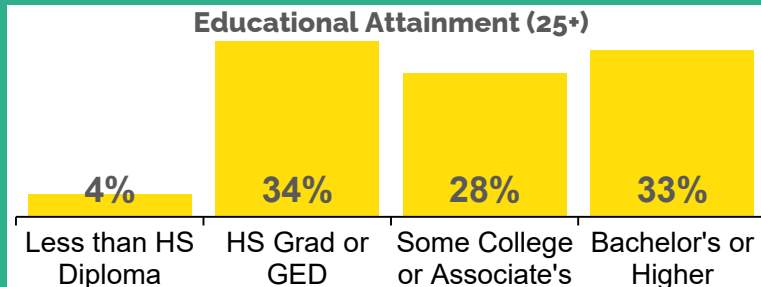

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

BLACK CHILDREN AND CHILDREN OF MULTIPLE RACES have disproportionately higher rates of CPS referrals

BLACK CHILDREN, HISPANIC CHILDREN AND CHILDREN OF MULTIPLE RACES AND CHILDREN OF SOME OTHER RACE have disproportionately higher substantiation rates

BLACK CHILDREN AND CHILDREN OF MULTIPLE RACES have disproportionately higher rates of valid GPS allegations
